Well I put the boat away for the winter last weekend, but managed to get one last trip in for the year. Initially, Chainsaw, Bertha and I were going to take Monday Oct 17th off work to try our luck for some full moon walleve action on Mille Lacs. Chainsaw came down with what he thought was food poisoning the day before so he bowed out. Bertha and I got to the lake about 2:00PM so we needed to make a decision on where to put in. I called a co-worker of mine that was out the night before and he had some luck just outside Eddy's Resort. Then we made a trip to Lundeen's Tackle to get an idea where they thought would be best. As it turned out we didn't get much information there as Mr. Lundeen wasn't

in a real talkative mood. Bertha and I might have interrupted him from watching Oprah or something. He suggested we go out of Izatys and head to 3 mile reef, which is on the east side of the lake and getting pounded by what I guessed to be about 25 mile winds. I'm not quite sure why, but I guess we felt sorry for this guy and we each bought a crank bait before we left. We ended up going out of Eddy's which was on the calmer side of the lake. We planned to fish for muskies until dark, so we hit a few spots that I had see fish from our previous tournament. We fished Vineland Bay, and Rocky Reef area with no success seeing anything. As it got closer to dusk we switched over to trolling for walleyes. At about 6:45 Bertha landed our first fish a 15" range in about 10 feet of water. The fish seemed to be more relating to weeds then rocks that night. We fished Indian Point in the rocks with many boats around us and I didn't see many fish being caught, so we went back to the weeds for better luck. We each boated a couple more 15" fish which all seemed to be the same size. About 9:00PM I had a bigger fish that we fought for a while before we could get it in the net. This was a 24 ½ fish that was the fattest walleye that I think I have ever caught. About ½ hour later in almost the same spot Bertha caught an identical size fish. We thought it was the same fish I had just released, but I doubt that it was. We both had to work the next day so we headed off the lake at 10:00PM with three fish in the live well and a couple of nice fish we released. A nice day to end the season on!

Adventures with Crystal Marine

As some of you may know, I hit a rock while fishing the tournament on my new favorite lake, Rush Lake. My new \$600 navigation unit indicated that there was a passage around a rock bar, which I took, but the rocks reached up to grab me anyway. At first, I thought it may be just a prop problem, and took that in to get fixed. Two weeks later, I put the repaired prop on, but noticed when I spun it, that the propshaft was making 1/4" circles as it went around. So, I took it in to Crystal Marine to be repaired, along with the skeg. The first prognosis was that the propshaft and seals would need replacing, for a total cost of \$1235. So I said, 'go ahead' and decided I'd have to cut back on Senkos for next year. Two weeks later, Crystal called back to say that the patient was in worse shape than they expected, and a new lower unit would be needed at a cost of over \$3000. I then went to my insurance specialist, Old Fart, for financial assistance. After two more weeks, the insurance was arranged, and the same day that I talked to the main insurance office, Crystal Marine called again to say that they had made a mistake. Apparently, they got my motor mixed up with another one, and it didn't need the whole lower unit after all. Now, they told me that the job was done and that the total bill would be \$730 (with \$275 of that being the skeg). So I called off the money folks and went and picked the beast up. It will not be water-tested until after the banquet, but I'm confident that it just might be OK. After all that, there's a good lesson to learn, and that is 'Watch out for FR's' and stay away from Rush Lake for more than just that reason.
